Key stage 2 have enjoyed their recycling topic this half term. NELC visited Key Stage 2 to provide an educational talk and a fun

Key stage 2 have enjoyed their '6 Course Meal' reading challenge. Each course represented a different type of text- pupils really extended their reading!

Key stage 3 Students had the opportunity to visit Heta and have a tour of their facilities. Students were given a talk about how the Heta apprenticeships work. We were then given a tour around their workshops, where current students were planning, developing and implementing their ideas. Students even got the chance to try some of the machinery.

Key stage 3 have also had focus on Science Experiments this half term, which has seen a rise in the engagement in the subject. The students have made a prediction from an enquiry question, explained their method and conducted fair tests to find out if their predictions were correct! Enquiry questions have included 'Which ice cube will melt the quickest?' and 'How will changing the size of beaker affect the time it takes for the candle to go out?' Along with other enquiry questions.





We have built up a strong relationship with a local community farm over this half term. Students have gone each Wednesday to take part in helping the farm with planting and looking after their animals. It has been such a success, that we are exploring the option of a number of students going back after half term on 'work experience' at the farm.

In maths, the students have had a new approach to their lessons. They have had an 'enquiry quiz' at the start of the block of lessons, so they are aware of their areas to improve on and to choose their target for the half term. During maths, the lessons have then focused on those areas and at the end of the lessons they revisited their quiz and all made progress from their original score which we are all incredibly proud of.

We hope you have a great half term and look forward to welcoming you back!


One of our students was lucky enough to spend the day with Hull Trains onboard their new fleet. He was treated to an ride in the cab to Selby and had his lunch served in First Class.

Welcome to the Sevenhills news update.

We are delighted to announce that this term has seen a return to our home site for some of our staff and learners. We would all like to extend our thanks to staff at Phoenix and Park who accommodated us and continue to support the teaching and learning that is ongoing during our restoration work.

A new model on site at Sevenhills has seen KS4 students working in a more nurturing environment and has produced amazing results: attendance which is 7% above the national average; increased behavior points/corresponding behavior trips and an invigorated approach to reading which has been embraced by every learner on site.

Vocational learning has taken an exciting route as some of our learners have engaged in Women in STEM learning and accessed construction lessons which have included learning how to build a 7 brick by 5 end stopped structure (which I am reliably informed is a wall...).

Students taking on the role of teacher and sporting fetching staff t-shirts are engaging in a program designed to mentor young people reading on a different site.

Outside of the school community our Sports teacher, John Mansfield has been spending time with students engaging with NCS Youth Zone and designing logos for the organization's branding competition. KS4 learner Spencer designed a clever logo which has made it to the final two. We share his pride in this achievement. #Team GYM (Generating Young Minds).

Students have also been to the National Cycling Championships in Manchester to support the work they are doing in Sports Studies and they thoroughly enjoyed the experience, learning in a different and exciting environment.
